

How to donate.

1. Contact the Minnesota Milk Bank for Babies (MnMBB) by phone 763-546-8051 or online at info@mnmilkbank.org
2. Complete a verbal screening over the phone with them.
3. Complete the Written Screening forms provided.
4. MnMBB will send you a kit, including information about getting any required blood testing done prior to donations – all paid for by the milk bank.
5. Your stored milk can be donated when approved by the screening process.
6. Once approved, call the South Central Minnesota Breast Milk Depot to arrange to drop off your frozen milk.

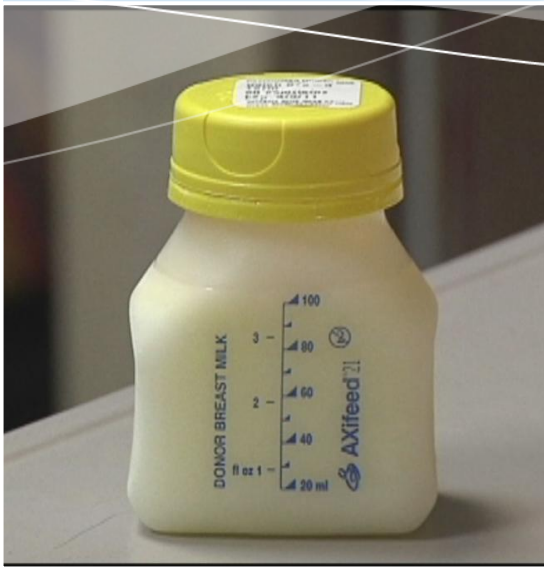

For various reasons, a mother may not always be able to produce enough breast milk for her baby. The South Central Minnesota Breast Milk Depot makes it possible for women with an ample supply of breast milk to share that gift with an infant in need.

Second only to mother's own breast milk*, donated milk is a wonderful way for babies to receive the very best nutrition. Donor milk is often the difference between life and death. Getting the best daily nutrition is so important.



Donated breast milk makes a difference.

All mothers who donate have been carefully screened prior to donation. Screening includes having a blood test as well meeting other screening criteria.

Minnesota Milk Bank for Babies is a member of the Human Milk Banking Association of North America (HMBANA) and follows their strict guidelines and restrictions for screening donors.

Donated milk is gently pasteurized, tested for the presence of any bacteria, and then frozen prior to shipping.
